## Transfer Admission to UCLA

- 1) Junior-level standing (60 semester/90 quarter units completed) by the time of transfer
- 2) Approximate GPA of 3.0 or higher in transferable courses
- 3) Complete Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or UCLA general education requirements (highly recommended)
  - IGETC: A series of community college courses you should take to satisfy lower division requirements at UCLA
  - Required IGETC Subject Areas: (See your Community College advisor.)

- 2) Application fee (You may qualify for fee waiver; check with your Community College.)
- 3) Personal Statement including information such as:
  - Employment while attending school
  - Family responsibilities
  - Improvement in coursework
  - Involvement in campus organizations or community service
  - Circumstances regarding any academic difficulties

- 4) **OPTIONAL:** Scholarship Application ([www.ucop.edu/pathways](http://www.ucop.edu/pathways))
  - For scholarships, send supporting documentation. Follow online instructions and deadlines.
